For the applications referring to the positions with "New technologies and protection of fundamental rights: regulatory challenges in the European context" as specific research topic the project can be only drafted in English.

The oral section will assess the capacity to effectively present the research project, and to provide evidence of the knowledge of the related topics. The assessment of the research project will be based mainly on its originality and methodological soundness. The assessment of titles, experiences and publications will be based on respectively their relevance for the specific research area (for publications) and time needed to earn the title or complete the experience.
